

MARGUERITE C. GUALTIERI, MSW, ESQUIRE, is the Managing Attorney at the Support Center for Child Advocates (*Child Advocates*), where she has practiced for twenty-three years. In her current role, she oversees the agency's legal advocacy on behalf of 1,100 clients yearly, providing technical assistance and support to volunteer attorneys and representing individual clients in various court proceedings. Ms. Gualtieri has presented and trained locally and nationally on children's legal issues, including child abuse/neglect law, representation of children and youth dually involved in the dependent and delinquent systems, issues in termination of parental rights hearings, preparing social workers to testify in court, and the multi-disciplinary aspects of child advocacy. She participates in various Philadelphia child welfare and court committees that strive to improve policy and practice in the child welfare system, and is past co-chair of the ABA Section of Litigation Children's Rights Litigation Committee and the Family Law Litigation Committee.

Ms. Gualtieri is a graduate of Villanova University School of Law, where she was Editor-in-Chief of the Villanova Law Review, and holds an MSW from Temple University. Before joining *Child Advocates*, Ms. Gualtieri clerked in the United States District Court for the District of Delaware, and was a litigator at Cherry Ferrara Mutzel Belefonte McFadden & Wesner in Media, Pennsylvania. Ms. Gualtieri is the recipient of the 2016 American Bar Association YLD Child Advocate of the Year; 2016 St. Thomas More Award; and 2018 Philadelphia Bar Association Public Interest Section Bending the Arc Award.
